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Not only tradition but also loving sentiments prompt men to observe anniversaries...birthdays, graduations, weddings, installations, admissions, ordinations, foundations, etc. For Colegio de San Clemente, its 30th Year of Foundation is worth remembering as it is a grand time to give thanks. CDSC school years are replete with varied activities all hinged on and aligned with the mission and goal of the school and engaged in by both the personnel and students. These activities/events, at times seemingly difficult but amusing and enjoyable, are held either inside the classrooms or out at the patio; or they are immersions in the community, reaching out and doing livelihood activities; and even further away, they take place in the city and some extended provincial trips to offer a wider exposure and richer cultural experience. Particular groups within the school would go to visit the sick and those in prison. Some others conduct catechism and socialization in the public school. To cap it all off there are medical/dental/laboratory/opto missions where many people troop in for some kind attention and consultation, examination and treatment, and the much needed medicines all for free. Of course, the dance time with Clementians at the patio which ushers to the culmination of each year, will always be a treasure to remember.

Apart from the aforementioned, celebrating the CDSC Anniversary of Foundation poses an invitation: ¹ to reminisce the proud past with its hardships and glories and recall its humble beginnings; ² to trace the struggles in many circumstances through the years and the serious efforts put into it; ³ and to stay steadfast in its vision-mission so that Colegio de San Clemente will always be as it is now.... faithful to the Church and fruitful in the educative task entrusted to it. While the difficulties of the present time continue to press on it, CDSC will always wear that badge of Christian optimism. With hopes pinned on God, it will persevere to serve the community where it is situated and the world as well, through continuing quality catholic education.

Last but never the least, celebrating the Anniversary of Foundation rings a challenge to the entire Colegio de San Clemente...administrators, teachers, non-teaching personnel, and students including their parents and families. In giving formation to the children, St. Josemaria Escriva says... first, the parents; then the teachers; and with that, the formation of the children follows. CDSC therefore, urges the complementary roles of the home and the school, i.e., of both the parents and the teachers in this endeavor. CDSC, as all catholic schools are, is in the middle of an environment clouded by relativism and where many people, from the highest to the lowest rung of society seem to be at a loss. There is always a battle in a catholic school such as Colegio de San Clemente, and it will continue

to fight this battle i.e... to teach and exemplify the objective norms and values which are the very foundation of the dignity of the human person. CDSC will urgently speak about genuine love and will help each student become “bida – be the change” and make a difference. This way, CDSC can help address the seeming scarcity of principled individuals who are and will always be for justice, truth and peace. This is like climbing a hill, and with God’s grace and mercy, reaching the peak and realizing the goal.

CDSC is now 30...thirty years of existence and responsible stewardship...thirty years of dreams and aspirations to build: first, the Pre-school, Grade School, then the High School and finally the Tech-Voc Section (CDSC rose from 4 small classrooms to 3 buildings)... thirty years of prayers and hard work: initially with less than 100 students...thirty years of personnel development and growth in the profession: starting with only 4 staff members to a current total of 25 teaching and 13 non-teaching personnel. The school publication, “Hasik”, documents the yearly aspects of the development of Colegio de San Clemente. As of date, CDSC has as her gift to the Church, to the Community and to the World...5,940 Pre-school Graduates (1984-2014); 3,840 Grade School Graduates (1988-2014); 3, 881 High School Graduates (1994-2014); and 228 Tech-Voc Graduates (1995-2014) who are now in their various fields of endeavor...Medicine, Dental Medicine, Nursing, Media & Communication, Business and Accountancy, Computer Technology, Hotel & Restaurant Management, Human Resource Management, Social Work, Philippine Studies and Community Development and other fields in Science and Arts.

CDSC is a FAPE Accredited school. Aside from its academic and administrative pursuits, CDSC has active linkages, among others, with TESDA, the Angono Municipal Government, and the Rizal Provincial Government particularly re its Tech-Voc offerings. Very soon CDSC will become a TESDA Assessment Center.

Accompanied by our Lady and St. Joseph, and also our patron, St. Clement, Colegio de San Clemente continues the journey and will pray and work hard all the more in the coming years. With feet on solid ground and gaze fixed up above, the CDSC Family will always have that strong yearning to hear from the Master Teacher...”work well- done!”
